Pets Flash Cards

Having a pet takes a lot of responsibility. On index cards, help your child draw or glue pictures of familiar pets, such as dogs, cats, fish, snakes, and birds. On another set, draw pictures of different environments where the each pet might live.

Have your child match each pet with its home. Review the name of each animal and talk about why they live there. What do they eat? Where do they sleep? If you had one as a pet, how would you take care of them?



Kids Chore Chart



Teaching kids how to do household chores is a meaningful part of growing up. They teach practical life and academic skills, as well as foster a sense of responsibility and community.

Create a chart with 5-10 age-appropriate chores that your child can do each week. Every time they complete a chore (putting away their toys, putting their dish in the sink, brushing their teeth without being told,) they can receive a sticker or another simple reward.

Responsibilities Flower

Using colored construction paper, help your child draw and cut out a stem, a flower pot, and 5 flower petals. (You can also use a popsicle stick for the stem.) On the flower pot, write their first name. On each petal, your child can write or draw something they're responsible for, such as their toys, their homework, or their actions.

Glue or tape the pieces together and hang the flower somewhere your child can see it every day, like on the fridge or on a bedroom door.
