Reading Legacies 2023 Annual Report BOOK BRIDGES PROGRAM




The purpose of our **Book Bridges program** is to instill the joy of reading in children, strengthen relationships between incarcerated parents and their children through the read-aloud experience, and establish the habit of reading aloud together regularly in the home.

In 2023, the program expanded across four San Diego County detention facilities serving both men and women. We hosted monthly, in-person workshops with parents within these facilities. We are thankful to the San Diego County Sheriff's Department and our dedicated volunteers for their ongoing support, as well as the generous contributions from community organizations and individuals who have financially supported our program.

The program received endorsement from San Diego County District Attorney Summer Stephan following our participation in the National Association of Women Judges' annual event, Success Inside & Out, focusing on incarcerated women. Our efforts also extended to women at the Vista Hill Foundation's ParentCare Family Recovery facilities. Here, we collaborate with chemically dependent women and their families who face

significant challenges such as child abuse, domestic violence, and homelessness. Our program encourages and empowers these women to engage in reading aloud with their children during one-on-one time, providing powerful benefits for all involved, particularly the children who greatly benefit from their parents' love and attention.

Reading Legacies 2023 Annual Report FIRST TEACHERS PROGRAM



The purpose of our **First Teachers program** is to empower parents as their child's first teachers by educating and motivating them to read aloud with children regularly at home.

In 2023, Reading Legacies hosted monthly "Family Story Hours" at Liberty Station, supported by volunteers who are typically parent-youth pairs, often from National Charity League and/or Teen Volunteers in Action. These volunteers serve as exemplary role models for the importance of reading together as a family. Additionally, in June and December, the program held large-scale outdoor "Family Story Hour" events at Liberty Station featuring authors Lauren Freckles (of the Babbling Beth series) and Jashon Sykes (former NFL player and author of "Multitask with Jarvis and Dad"). Families from across San Diego County joined these events.

The First Teacher Parent Workshops were conducted for parents of the Episcopal Community Services - Castle Park Head Start Center and parents enrolled in the Casa de Amistad program, primarily serving Spanish-speaking parents. In collaboration with Solana Beach County Library, we promoted the use of local public libraries and

provided additional resources to families during our workshops. Based on research evidence, the six-workshop series is designed to empower parents, encouraging them to share the joy of reading with their children while participating in open discussions with facilitators and other parents.

Reading Legacies 2023 Annual Report STORYBOOK INSPIRATIONS PROGRAM



Our **Storybook Inspirations** program is designed to support and enhance intergenerational relationships by providing meaningful communication between generations as they read stories aloud together.

Staff and volunteers assist participants with book recommendations, provide encouragement, videotape each participant, and send a secure link of the recording to the child(ren) with whom they wish to stay in touch.

Throughout 2023, the program continued at the Liberty Station and Coronado Public Library locations. Over the summer, we expanded our program offerings through collaborations with Logan Heights Library and Point Loma/Hervey Branch Library. Towards the end of the year, Storybook Inspirations extended its reach to two retirement communities, Fredericka Manor and The Shores Post-Acute, with volunteer teams from Amazon and San Diego State University's business fraternity, Alpha Kappa Psi.

The Storybook Inspirations program participants successfully shared their video recordings with loved ones, including grandchildren residing in different parts of the country.

In 2023, the traditional Youth Readers model operated in Escondido, where students from Escondido High School Interact Club read to young children at Hickory Head Start Center. Similarly, in 4S Ranch, students from Del Norte High School Key Club engaged with children at the Kids Care Club child development center. At the Valencia Park/Malcolm X Library, in collaboration with the Day II Day Foundation, a group of Lincoln High School football players provided Family Story Hour to families visiting the library. Our collaboration with e3 Civic High School continued with student volunteers serving as virtual Youth Readers. Their recorded readings were shared with

Our collaboration with e3 Civic High School continued with student volunteers serving as virtual Youth Readers. Their recorded readings were shared with childcare centers for families to enjoy together at home. Later in the year, students began volunteering weekly at the Joyride Bookshop in the New Children's Museum, reading aloud with young children.

A unique application of the Youth Readers program was seen at Coronado Retirement Village, where groups of Girl Scouts of various ages volunteered monthly to read with seniors, creating meaningful interactions through shared reading experiences. This adaptation was also mirrored at ActivCare Retirement Community in 4S Ranch, where young Girl Scouts read with seniors, extending the program's impact across generations.




